Recipes by Rhonda

Ham & Cheese Breakfast Sliders

½ cup butter, cubed	12 dinner rolls, split
Plus 1 TBSP butter, divided	5 slices deli ham, halved
2 TBSP brown sugar	6 large eggs
2 TBSP spicy brown mustard, divided	2 TBSP 2% milk
1 tsp Worcestershire sauce	6 slices cheddar cheese

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a small saucepan, combine ½ cup butter, brown sugar, 1 TBSP mustard and Worcestershire sauce; bring to a boil. Cook and stir until sugar is dissolved, 1-2 minutes. Remove from the heat.
2. Place roll bottoms, cut side up, in an ungreased 13x9 inch baking dish. Top each with 1 piece of ham.
3. In a large bowl, whisk eggs, milk and remaining 1 TBSP mustard until blended. In a large nonstick skillet, heat the remaining 1 TBSP butter over medium heat. Pour in the egg mixture; cook and stir until eggs are thickened and no liquid egg remains. Spoon scrambled eggs evenly over ham. Top with cheese. Replace bun tops. Brush butter mixture over bun tops. Bake, uncovered, until cheese is melted, 10-15 minutes.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on January 4, 2024. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on Dec. 12, 2023.

Board approved Treasurer's Report (Dec) and approved bills (Jan 2024) as presented.

Patrick Cribbs and Ron Sabin with Dan's Sanitation discussed proposed revisions to renew our contract with them for trash services within the Village. No action taken.

Members of the newly established Pool Committee were present. The committee will operate in an advisory capacity, researching and developing a plan for a new pool. Luke Curl spoke for the committee and informed the Village Board about the Pool Committee and their activities to date. Members of the committee include Curl, Mandi Kramer, Ashley Einspahr, London Maris, Tod Bunker, Crystal Walgren and Evelyn Skelton.

Board approved the request from Angela Geihlsler, to forgive and release the lien (relating to the OOR Grant) by issuing a deed of reconveyance.

Kramer and Walgren reviewed Nursing Home Financial Reports for Nov 2023 and the Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board.

The Board reviewed the Chase County Sheriff's report for Dec 2023.

Board approved the proposal received McCook Flooring, for new carpet in the Village Office.

The Board discussed a property which is considered to be a nuisance property. Board approved moving forward with Nuisance Abatement as proposed. A letter has been drafted in accordance with procedures outlined by ordinance and reviewed by Arlan Wine.


