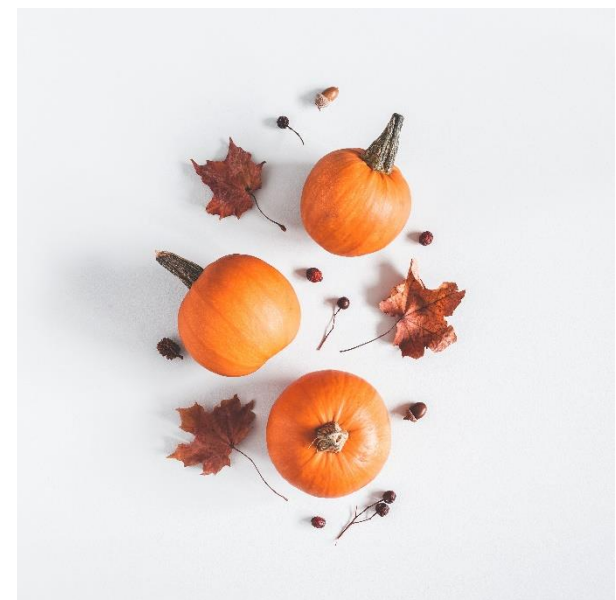
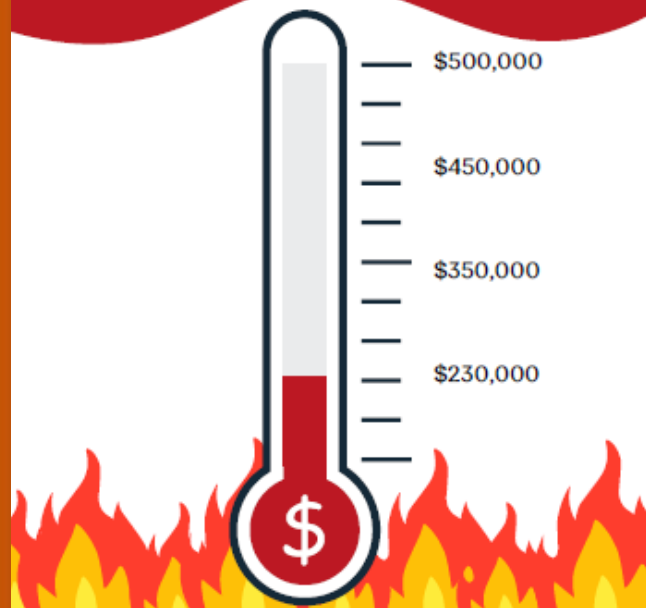

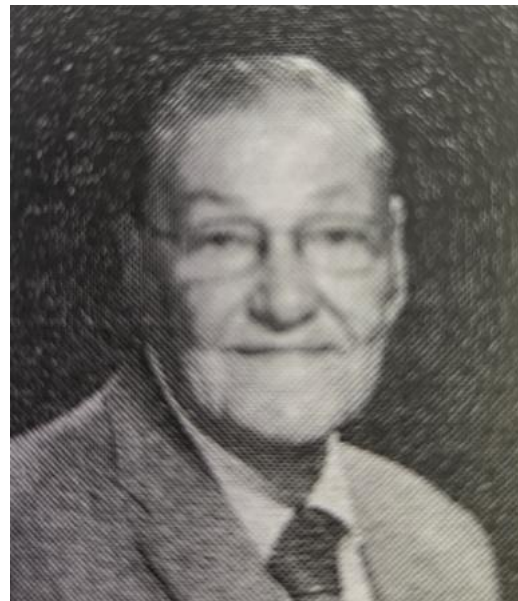

Village of Wauneta, Nebraska

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wauneta, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 6:30 p.m. on **September 10, 2024**, at the Wauneta Village Office.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Chairman Johnston publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review.

Present: B Kramer, R Einspahr, P Johnston. Absent: C Walgren, B Goings.

Guests: Arlan Wine (Village Attorney)

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Imperial Republican on Sept 5, 2024. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Chairman and all the Trustees. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice to the Chairman and all the Trustees. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Board approved the minutes of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees, held on August 13, 2024; and the minutes of the budget workshop meeting, held on August 28, 2024.

Board approved the Treasurer's Report (Aug) and approved bills (Sept) as presented.

Johnston and Einspahr reviewed Financial Reports (July) and the Nursing Home Committee Meeting Report with the Village Board. A Strategic Planning session for the nursing home is scheduled for September 18, 2024.

Board approved the nursing home contracting 12,500 gallons propane from Wauneta Crossroads (prepaid at \$1.52 per gallon).

The Board reviewed the Sheriff's Reports for August 2024. Discussion was held regarding a recent dog bite incident. Kramer will follow up with the Sheriff's Department.

Board approved propane contracts with Waun Crossroads for 2024-2025 as follows:

- 1600 gallons @ \$1.52 per gallon (prepaid) for the Ambulance Barn
- 1600 gallons @ \$1.52 per gallon (prepaid) for the Community Building
- 1100 gallons @ \$1.52 per gallon (prepaid) for the Fire Hall

Board approved the request for a Special Designated Liquor License, received from Wauneta Chamber, for Oktoberfest, to be held indoors and outdoors at 320 N Tecumseh (Fire Hall), on Sunday October 13, 2024, from 12:00 m to 10:00 pm.

Discussion was held on assessing a lien on a property to secure payment of the costs of nuisance abatement (167 N. Arikaree). No action taken.

The Board revisited the request from Southwest Public Power District (SWPPD) to grant easements on Village property to allow SWPPD to install, upgrade and maintain power lines. The Board had questions/concerns on the legal descriptions on the easements and will continue to work with legal counsel and SWPPD to work out details.

The Board heard recommendations from the Wauneta Planning Commission, as follows:

1. Lot Split into two parcels (Lot 19, Blk 1, South Subdivision)
2. Revisions to Zoning Ordinance, section 5.11.05, regarding height and lot requirements in the industrial district.

The Board is in favor of both recommendations and will move forward with the necessary steps/paperwork for approval.

Clerk's Report given by Skelton. The Budget Hearing is set for Tuesday, September 24, 2024, at 6:30 p.m.

Einspahr and Walgren were appointed as committee to review Village employee's wages.

Superintendent's Report given by Lawless.

This is an update of the Wauneta-Palisade School budget for this current school year. Also included is a budget history of our past several school years. The dollar amount of tax money requested for the 2024-25 school year is \$4,139,937.59 This amount is an increase of 2.15% from the previous year. Inflation has been a great challenge for everyone, including the school. However, I have worked very hard to keep our school budget numbers constant the past several years. I am proud that our total budget is similar to the 2014-15 school year, which was \$4,022,575.71. Below is a brief history of the total amount of tax dollars the district has collected. Churro Chex Mix

3 Cups corn chex ¾ cup brown sugar
3 cups rice chex 1 TBSP Cinnamon
1 ½ cups peanuts 1/3 C sugar
6 TBSP melted butter

Pour butter & brown sugar over the chex and peanuts.
Bake 5 minutes at 350 degrees
Mix cinnamon & sugar – pour over, stir – Bake 5 minutes.

Halloween Popcorn Balls

7 cups popped popcorn 6 ounces green melting chocolate
11 ounces Caramel candies 3 ounces purple melting chocolate
25 Marshmallows Popsicle sticks
½ cup (1 stick) Butter Halloween Sprinkles
1 teaspoon of cinnamon Edible eyeballs
8 ounces reese pieces

Prepare a baking sheet with parchment paper. Set aside.
In a large pot melt butter. Once melted add in caramel candies, marshmallows, and cinnamon. Stir with a rubber spatula until smooth. Add in popcorn and mix quickly. Fold in Reese pieces and then form into popcorn balls, about the size of an orange. You may want to spray your hands with cooking spray so they won't stick. Place on parchment paper and stick a popsicle stick in the center. Allow to cool completely.
Once cooled, dip the bottom of the popcorn ball into the desired chocolate color and sprinkles, then drizzle the opposite color over top. Add edible eyeballs or Halloween sprinkles over chocolate before it hardens to decorate.

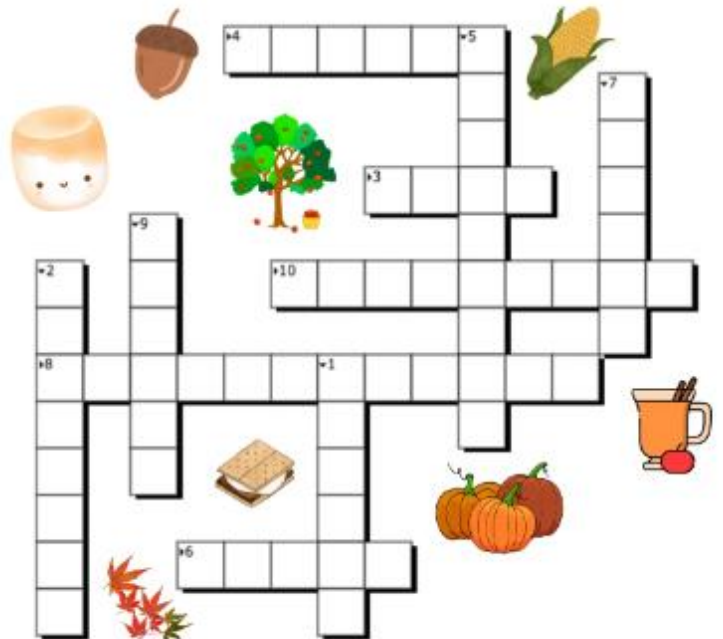
