

Recipes by Rhonda

Corn Tortilla Chicken Lasagna

36 corn tortillas (6 inches)

6 cups cubed cooked chicken breast

2 cans (one 28 ounces, one 16 ounces) kidney beans, rinsed and drained

3 jars (16 ounces each) salsa

3 cups (24 ounces) sour cream

3 large green peppers, copped

3 cans (3,8 ounces each) sliced ripe olives, drained

3 cups (12 ounces) shredded Montery Jack cheese

3 cups (12 ounces) shredded heddar cheese



In each of two greased 12 in x 9 in x 2 in baking dishes, arrange six tortillas. Top each with 1 cup chicken, 2/3 cup kidney beans, 1 cup salsa, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sour cream, $\frac{1}{2}$ cur green pepper, about $\frac{1}{3}$ cup olives, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Monterey Jack cheese and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup cheddar cheese. Repeat layers twice.

Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Uncover; bake 10-15 minutes longer or until the cheese is melted. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving. Yield: 2 casseroles (12 servings each).

Warembourg to Compete at National FFA Convention

Wauneta-Palisade senior Justin Warembourg has qualified to compete in the Agriscience Fair competition at the National FFA Convention. Justin's project won his division at the State FFA Convention in April. He then had to re-submit his edited report to the national judges, placing him in the top 10 in the nation and securing him a spot on stage to receive his award on October 25th in Indianapolis, IN.

Justin will have an online interview in late September, during which he will answer questions about his experiment. Justin's experiment tested the quality of different bottled water and tap water from the school. He tested the water for Total Hardness, Free Chlorine, Iron, Copper, Lead, Nitrate, Nitrite, MPS, Total Chlorine, Fluoride, Cyanuric Acid, Ammonia Chloride, Bromine, Total Alkalinity, Carbonate and pH. Core Hydration bottled water was the best quality of the brands he tested.



Do You Have a Lead Service Line? The Village of Wauneta needs your help! The State of Nebraska Dept of Environmental and Energy has made it mandatory that all utility providers comply with new reporting requirements regarding lead water service lines. The Village is required to supply an inventory of water service lines from the water main to the home. We are requesting help from property owners on identifying the service line entering the residence. Please complete the following survey and return it to the Village Office.

Adverse Health Effects of Lead

Drinking water that contains lead can damage a developing brain. It is especially harmful for children 6 and under and in adults, lead can increase blood pressure. With your help, your utility can reduce elevated levels of lead in your community.

Source of Lead

Your water system tests for lead levels regularly, but as you know, the source of lead in drinking water is often lead pipes and plumbing components in the distribution system that provides drinking water to your home.

Service Lines

Drinking water for your home is delivered from the water main to your home by a service line. Service lines can contain lead. identifying homes with lead service lines or lead components crucial because corrosion of these materials over time can cause lead to accumulate in your drinking water.

How to Determine If I Have a Lead Service

Check your records. Have you completed maintenance on your service line? Do you know when your home was built? If your home is older than 1988 and has the original service line or plumbing, then your home may have a lead service line or a lead component.

Inspect the service line yourself. You can save time and money and inspect the service line yourself. These lines typically enter your home through the wall facing the street on the lowest. Photographs design in a horse in bloth Radie. ME.

Start with a magnet or scratch test. Gently scratch the surface of the pipe with a coin. If the pipe is soft, easily scraped, silver, and a magnet doesn't stick, it is most likely lead.

- 1. Does a magnet stick? If so and the line is dull grey when scratched, this portion of the service line is galvanized steel.
- 2. If the magnet doesn't stick, it is same color as a penny when scratched or has greenish blue build up, this portion of the service line is copper.

Inside the house

3. If the magnet doesn't stick, it is white-ish yellow or grey, is joined with a clamp, screw or glue, this portion of the service line is plastic or Chlorinated polyvinyl chloride (GPVC).
